ACT/SAT INFORMATION

To register for the ACT or SAT, students must apply online by deadline posted. **The high school CEEB code is 365-747.** Be sure to submit payment with your registration. See a counselor if you have questions about filling out your registration material.

Students who receive assistance for the school lunch program may also qualify for a test fee waiver. See Mrs. Fuller for more information.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

The following are guidelines that students need to follow when submitting a college application.

1. Online Applications. You will need to contact a School Counselor should you be completing an online application. They will ensure the application is accurate and send any necessary documents (transcript, test scores, etc.)

CAMPUS VISITS

GUIDELINES

The following are guidelines that students must meet in order to take college visits:

1. Juniors and Seniors are permitted two campus visits.
2. Students can schedule visits online. Notify the guidance office of the visit to receive paperwork needed for the visit. **The paperwork needs to be signed by a parent and your teachers prior to your visit. Please do not wait until the day before your visit to get this paperwork.**

3. The campus visit will be counted as a school activity as long as the **Campus Visitation Verification form is returned to the Guidance office within three days after the visit.** Failure to do so will result in an unexcused absence on the visitation day.

4. **No visits will be scheduled the first and last two weeks of each semester. Students that attend during this time will not have the day excused as a college visit.**

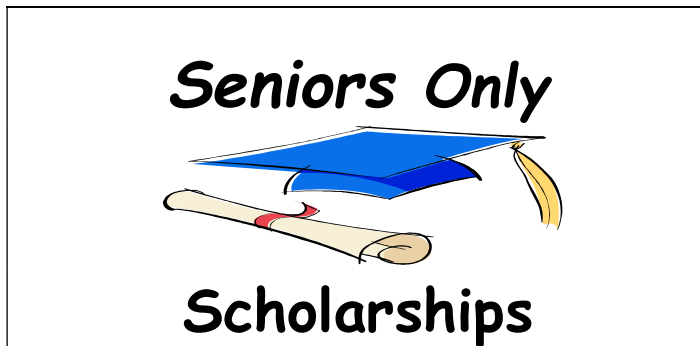
CCP Students

Attention Boys: You are required by law to register with the Selective Service by your 18th birthday. Have your Social Security number handy and log on to the Selective Service website at: www.sss.gov.

NCAA Clearinghouse - Seniors who plan to participate in Division I or Division II intercollegiate athletics, must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse prior to college athletic recruitment visits. **The NCAA requires ACT or SAT scores be sent to the Clearinghouse directly from the testing agencies.** Enter code 9999. Log on to www.eligibilitycenter.org. Be sure to notify the Guidance Office after you have registered, so your current official transcript will be sent directly to NCAA Clearinghouse.

6. Paper clip the application and return to Mrs. Overturf no later than 8:30 a.m. on the posted deadline.
7. **All recommendations are to be turned into Mrs. Fuller. Do NOT ask teachers to give them to you.**
8. **GPA, Rank and ACT/SAT information is to be left blank by the student. This information will be completed by Mrs. Fuller.**
